Microgeneration of electricity (from solar, wind, or water) is an important element of the country's renewable energy strategy and so the **Department for Energy Security and Net Zero (DESNZ)** recently launched a consultation into barriers to Community Energy Projects (https://www.gov.uk/government/calls-for-evidence/barriers-tocommunity-energy-projects). The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) will be responding and has created a survey of parish and town councils to inform its response. # **Local Council Vacancies**

Today is the last chance to apply for the vacancy at **Newnham Parish Council** near Daventry (30 hours per month, closing date 10 May 2024). In the far north of the county **Bulwick Parish Council** has a vacancy for a Clerk/RFO working 22 hours per month. There are just 138 electors and a five-seat council. The precept for

2024/25 is £15,000. The deadline for applications is 20 May 2024. Meanwhile, just over the border into Leicestershire just north of Market Harborough, **East Langton Parish Council** has a vacancy for a Clerk working 5 hours per week.
