National Two-Minute Silence to Mark VJ Day 80

On Monday, the government announced a national two-minute silence on **Friday 15 August 2025** to mark the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War and encouraged members of the public to participate. A Service of Remembrance will honour and remember those who fought and died during the Second World War in the Far East at the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire, which will be broadcast live on BBC1 from midday. Internal Audit Service

The Northants CALC Internal Audit Service (IAS) provides internal audit to around 80% of the county's parish and town councils. Yesterday, our panel of Internal Auditors (IAs) had its end-of-year wash up meeting to compare notes on common issues arising during the audit of the year ending 31 March 2025 and to begin the preparations for the audit of the year ending 31 March 2026. At the meeting I presented the results of our IAS Satisfaction survey (thank you to all those that responded) and I am pleased to report that **an incredible 98% of respondents said they would recommend the IAS to another council!** A full report on the survey will be in the July/August *eUpdate*. Asset Devolution

On Wednesday, the West Northamptonshire Council (WNC) Cabinet met for an epic five-hour meeting (watch again

at <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MwULicM-SN8</u>). One of the items on the agenda was to consider the transfer of **Cracks Hill**, a 20-acre amenity site to Crick Parish Council and a small parcel of **land at High Street**, **Wootton** to Wootton Parish Council. Both transfers were agreed, at £1 each. The associated report (see <u>https://tinyurl.com/mrb5hdcr</u>) says "*The proposed freehold transfer is consistent with the principles that assets such as this would deliver greater benefit if they were managed within, and by, the communities that they serve.*" Whilst, Northants CALC has been pushing that line for over a decade, this is a rare example of it being implemented by a principal council. In agreeing the transfers, WNC Leader Cllr Mark Arnull said: "*I think it is very important that we look at these sites and transfers to parish councils where they can do good. I will work with the Director of Assets and Estates to look at future transfers where they are appropriate for the benefit of the community*".

Independent Remuneration Panel Member Wanted

North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) operates a scheme of members' allowances for its councillors based upon the recommendations of an **Independent Remuneration Panel**. All councillors receive a basic allowance, and certain councillors and other co-opted members also receive special responsibility allowances as office holders. The council is looking to appoint up to five members of the Independent Remuneration Panel to review the Members Allowances Scheme from time to time and recommend its findings to the council. The post is not salaried, but each Independent Remuneration Panel Member will receive an allowance of £500 per review undertaken, plus expenses.
