# Mini eUpdate from Northants CALC

#### **Local Government Pay**

Negotiations on local government pay for 2025/26 are reaching a critical stage. The unions claim, tabled back in January, was for an extra £3,000 on all Spinal Column Points (SCPs), which would have been roughly equivalent to a 10% increase. In addition, the unions asked for one extra day leave per year and a reduction in the standard working week from 37 hours to 35 hours with no reduction in pay. This week, the Employer's Side responded with a "full and final" offer of 3.2% on all SCPs (so roughly a third of what the unions wanted) and no additional leave or reduction in hours. The unions will now meet with their members to discuss next steps, and ballots or even industrial action seem likely over the summer and into the autumn. I will keep you posted.

#### **Polling Day Success**

With one or two minor issues, Polling Day went well yesterday across Northamptonshire and now the unitary councils begin the awesome job of counting the votes. The count for unitary councillors is today and for parish and town councillors it is tomorrow. **By tonight** we will know the political makeup of the two unitary councils. Thanks go to the hundreds and hundreds of polling station staff and those that help with the count. Elections couldn't happen without them.

# **Technology to Tackle Fly-tipping**

On Tuesday, the government announced measures to tackle fly-tipping vehicles and clean up streets, lanes, and rural areas. Principal councils will work with the police to identify, seize and crush vehicles. **Drones and mobile CCTV cameras** will be deployed to identify cars and vans belonging to fly-tippers so they can be destroyed. The government has launched a rapid review to reduce red tape blocking councils from seizing and crushing vehicles. The Environment Agency will also carry out identity and criminal record checks on operators in the sector. They will now be able to fund the cost of policing the industry through permits, increasing their powers to revoke permits, issue enforcement notices and fines. ### **2025 Parish and Town Elections**

The Democracy Club has provided an interesting overview of the nominations for parish and town council elections in 2025. 1,274 local councils across 12 principal local authorities in England were up for election, including **3 city councils**, **133 town councils**, **and 1,138 parish councils**. Despite the large number of councils involved, a significant portion of seats - 65.7% - have been filled without a poll. Only 356 wards saw a poll yesterday, leaving 21.5% of seats vacant due to a lack of candidates. Interestingly, 70 wards had no candidates at all, and 31 councils

are inquorate (but none in Northamptonshire!). Political party representation remains low, with only 17.4% of candidates affiliated with registered parties. This highlights the grassroots nature of these elections, where community involvement and independent candidates play a crucial role. Parish and town council annual meetings start next week. If you haven't already seen it, have a look at our Annual Meeting Q&A (<u>click here</u>). 161 of 220 parish and town councils have vacancies to fill following the elections, so there will be a lot of co-opting going on at the May meetings! And remember that **ALL** councillors must complete a **Register of Interests** within 28 days of taking office (a legal requirement). North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) has an electronic form and West Northamptonshire Council (WNC) has a paper form which, once completed, should be sent by email to <a href="mailto:registerofinterests@westnorthants.gov.uk">registerofinterests@westnorthants.gov.uk</a>. Please note that NNC/WNC **do not** need copies of the councillors' Declarations of Acceptance of Office forms.
