Ten Years On

In the wall just on the right as you go in through the revolving door (literally, not metaphorically) of One Angel Square, now headquarters of West Northamptonshire Council (WNC), is a foundation stone, which was laid this week ten years ago (https://northantscalc.gov.uk/foundation-stone). The inscription reads "This foundation stone was laid by Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant for Northamptonshire, David Laing Esq, Leader of the County Council, Cllr Jim Harker OBE, Chief Executive Dr Paul Blantern, Chairman of the County Council, Cllr Phil Larratt. Tuesday 18 August 2015. Northamptonshire County Council." David Laing sadly passed away in March 2024, none of the other people mentioned are still involved, and the county council itself was abolished in 2021. It is a poignant reminder of what local government in Northamptonshire has been through in the past decade.

Local Council Vacancies

Northampton Town Council, which is the largest parish or town council in England, has a vacancy for an **Administrative Support Officer (ASO)** to complement its growing operations. The post is full time with a salary of £28,624 – £31,586. The ASO will provide administrative support to the Town Clerk, Deputy Town Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer. This is an excellent opportunity for someone to get involved in local government with an exciting, growing, council. The closing date for applications is **24 August 2025**.

Farthinghoe is a small village on the A422 between Banbury and Brackley. **Farthinghoe Parish Council** has an immediate vacancy for a Clerk/RFO working 4.6 hours per week (20 hours per month). There are 7 councillors, and the council set a precept for 2025/26 of £14,207. The closing date for applications is **28 August 2025**.

Owing to the forthcoming retirement of long-serving clerk **Gary Denby**, the following three vacancies are now advertised:

Moreton Pinkney Parish Council has a vacancy or a Clerk/RFO working 3.5 hours per week. Moreton Pinkney is a small village with 341 electors and is in rural South Northamptonshire, between Canons Ashby (National Trust) and Sulgrave, on the old 'Banbury Lane' between Banbury and Northampton. Administration responsibilities include village street lighting and mowing contractors. The council has 7 seats and the precept for 2025/26 is £13,250. The deadline for applications is **29 September 2025**.

Preston Capes Parish Council has a vacancy or a Clerk/RFO working 3.5 hours per week. Preston Capes is a small village with 170 electors and is in rural South Northamptonshire, between Canons Ashby (National Trust) and Sulgrave, on the old 'Banbury Lane' between Banbury and Northampton. Administration responsibilities include the village mowing contractors. The council has 7 seats and the precept for 2025/26 is £8,600. The deadline for applications is **29 September 2025**.

Culworth Parish Council has a vacancy or a Clerk/RFO working 7.5 hours per week. Culworth is a small village with 322 electors and is in rural South Northamptonshire, close to Sulgrave Manor with its George Washington (USA) connections, on the old 'Banbury Lane' between Banbury and Northampton. Administration responsibilities include village street lighting, mowing contractors, the village cricket field and a burial ground; assisting with the

replacement of the village hall. The council has 7 seats and the precept for 2025/26 is £38,000. The deadline for applications is **29 September 2025**.
