Return of Election Expenses

Yesterday we had our first wash-up meeting following the local elections with the Elections Teams from North Northamptonshire Council (NNC) and West Northamptonshire Council (WNC). The deadline for **ALL COUNCILLORS** who stood for election on 1 May 2025 to return their declaration of election expenses, even if

there were none, was 29 May 2025. Shockingly, **434** councillors in North Northamptonshire and **293** councillors in West Northamptonshire are yet to return their election expenses. Failure to do so by the deadline without an authorised excuse is **a criminal offence** and Northamptonshire Police does not want to have to deal with hundreds of prosecutions! One common misunderstanding is that if the number of candidates for the election was the same as or less than the number of seats then "there wasn't an election". There was! It's just that it was uncontested. You still need to declare your election expenses. The other common misunderstanding is that if a candidate did not incur any expenses (which is usually the case at parish council level) then no declaration is required. Not true! All candidates must declare their expenses, even if it is a nil declaration. You'll find the forms at https://northantscalc.gov.uk/councillor-forms-anddocuments. Please could ALL COUNCILLORS check they have returned their declarations of election expenses. Thank you. Another bit of news from the meeting was that NNC and WNC are still busy calculating the precise cost of the elections, so are unlikely to be recharging parish and town councils until the autumn.

Council Vacancies

Little Addington is a small village between Irthlingborough and Thrapston. There are 267 electors and 7 councillors. The precept for 2025/26 is £16,600. Little Addington Parish Council has a vacancy for a Clerk working 25 hours per month. The deadline for applications is **30 June 2025**.

Collyweston Parish Council has a vacancy for a Clerk/RFO working 10 hours per week. Collyweston is a small village with 450 electors and is the second most northerly parish in Northamptonshire. The council has 7 seats and the precept for 2025/26 is £31,000. The deadline for applications is **18 July 2025**.
